Rick C. Sasso, M.D.

- Dr. Sasso presented at the 16th International Meeting on Advanced Spine Techniques in Vienna, Austria, this past July. In addition to participating in various lectures, Dr. Sasso also presented an abstract he co-authored entitled, *Blood Medal Ion Levels Following Implantation of an All-Metal Lumbar Intervertebral Disc Replacement*.
- This summer, Dr. Sasso was a visiting professor at the Texas Back Institute in Dallas. Dr. Sasso presented at their grand rounds program, and gave a lecture on Interoperative Spinal Navigation.
- In October, Dr. Sasso was a faculty member at the 8th Annual Symposium on Innovative Techniques in Spine Surgery in Phoenix. This symposium was sponsored by the Organization of Spinal Teaching and Research. Dr. Sasso presented the results of the FDA studies for cervical disc replacement and gave a talk on lumbar artificial disc replacement.
- Dr. Sasso was a course director for the American Association of Orthopaedic Surgeons (AAOS) / Cervical Spine Research Society (CSRS) - Contemporary Techniques in Spine Surgery meeting this November. In addition to being a course director, Dr. Sasso also gave various talks, spine surgical demonstrations, and he was a lab instructor for surgical skills labs.

Jonathan P. Gentile, M.D.

 In July, Dr. Gentile presented at the annual meeting of the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians. At this meeting, Dr. Gentile gave a presentation on failed back; discussing the diagnosis and various treatment options.

Paul E. Kraemer, M.D.

- In August, Dr. Kraemer presented for the neurosurgical grand rounds at Indiana University. His talk was entitled What Orthopaedics Taught Me About Spine Surgery.
- Dr. Kraemer was an invited lecturer for Medtronics, where he gave a talk entitled Rethinking Adjacent Segment Disease.
- Dr. Kraemer is a faculty / chair member for a regional symposium on complex spine problems. This meeting will be hosted in late November in Kentucky.
